History of *Judge*

Judge, a weekly satirical magazine, was founded in 1881 by a group of artists who seceded from the staff of the popular comic weekly, *Puck*. Founders included cartoonist James Albert Wales, dime novel publisher Frank Tousey, and author George H. Jessop. The magazine cultivated bold satire and good drawing, in a quarto format with a chromolithographic cover and center spread. After a strong start, the magazine found itself struggling to compete with its very similar rival, *Puck*.

Publisher William J. Arkell purchased the magazine in 1885, and used it in part to attack the Democratic administration of Grover Cleveland. Republican support boosted the magazine's circulation, and by the early 1890s it had reached 50,000. Cartoonists Eugene Zimmerman, Bernard Gillam, Art Young, Richard Outcault and James Montgomery Flagg were regular contributors. Circulation continued to grow; by 1912 it had reached 100,000 and *Judge* had overtaken its main rival, *Puck*, which finally expired in 1918.

Sales dropped drastically during the Great Depression, forcing the price to be reduced to ten cents per issue. Circulation did not respond, and in 1932 *Judge* became a monthly magazine at fifteen cents a number. It ceased publication in 1947.
